Our strategic objectives are:


- We will transform **Children and Young People's** lives through impactful arts and creativity.

Background

Impact Arts has a long history across Glasgow and the West Coast, delivering high quality youth engagement. The development of the Youth Worker role is essential within our organisation and reflects the increased need for specialised youth support within our employability work.

The role of Youth Worker for Creative Pathways has been designed to give our young people varying levels of support, from 1-2-1 conversations, group work, accreditation prep and ultimately, to support them to take their next positive steps.

We are looking for someone who is dynamic, who will bring considerable youth experience, energy and passion to the role and who wants to join our mission in tackling inequalities across Scotland.

Purpose

To support young people attending Impact Arts programmes to achieve their outcomes and to progress on to further education, training or employment.

To lead on continuous improvements of programmes, ensuring high quality social outcomes and meeting stakeholders' expectations

Main Responsibilities:

To be the first point of support and contact for young people engaging in Impact Arts' creative programmes

To actively support young people to attend the programme and actively take steps to remove any barriers for regular attendance

To create a structured accreditation plan for each programme and deliver to this plan in partnership with the Creative Lead

To create an individual progression and development plan for each young person you work with and support them to achieve this in line with the project outcomes through 1-2-1 meetings

Regular updates and reporting to Project Co-ordinators and/or Programme Manager to ensure targets and outcomes are being met and to raise any concerns

Responsible for day to day administration (and Salesforce data entry where appropriate) when projects are live i.e. Registers/participant evaluation /participant travel costs and expenses/project evaluation/case studies /internal communications along side the Creative Lead

To research and connect with progression and personal development opportunities for young people in their local area and beyond

To support young people's emotional and mental wellbeing

Responsible for implementing Impact Arts' Child Protection Policy and following all procedures to do with Safeguarding in line with best practice

To research and create information for external support services in relevant local authorities to allow us to signpost young people as and when necessary

To deliver and/or identify issue based training to young people as and when required

To successfully engage with local community stakeholders and partner organisations, developing strong relationships that maximise the opportunities for our young people

To lead on the continuous improvement of programmes, ensuring consistency of approach throughout Impact Arts and developing new ideas
